The **Webelos Adventure Camp** is four days and three nights of outdoor camping, learning about the history of Scouting while earning activity badges and having **FUN!**

## LEADERSHIP

Each pack provides its own leadership through parents, leaders, and other family members. All camp leaders must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. **National BSA policy requires two-deep adult leadership.** A minimum of two adults must be in camp. At least one leader must be 21 years of age; others may be 18 or older. A Scout to adult ratio of 8 to 1 per schedule group is required at camp. See the Webelos Adventure Camp Leaders' guide for more information.

## PREPARATION

- Register with your pack or Den leader and pay fees. Ask your Cubmaster for help!
- Have parent or legal guardian complete attached **Part A and B of the Annual BSA Health and Medical Record** and sign it. All blanks must be completed.
- Pack your personal things. Refer to the Leaders' Guide page 14.
- Go to camp with your den!

## CAMP LIFE

All campers live in canvas tents and sleep on cots with meals served in the Steak-n-Shake Dining Hall. Webelos work on activity pins during the day and a host of activities at night. Warm showers are available. A health officer is always on duty. *Parents are encouraged to come for dinner and the closing campfire ceremony the Tuesday or Friday your pack is in camp.*

**reservations taken.** The \$15 reservation fee is a down payment and is part of the total fee for Webelos and adults.

**EARLY BIRD deadline for discounted fees is April 13, 2012.** Full fees, health and medical record forms, attendance rosters, workership applications, and copies of parent's insurance cards (front & back) due.

**April 13 – two weeks before camp** – Regular fee \$15 non refundable reservations accepted.

**Final payment of regular fees and forms are due to a CAC Scout Service Center at least 2 weeks prior to your scheduled camp session.**
