Recapping 2017; Looking Ahead to 2018 for the Northeast District

It's hard to believe, but 2017 was another **GREAT YEAR** for the Northeast District. With your help, we were able to serve 1,412 youth and 529 adult members aligned with 38 Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops, Venturing Crews, and a Sea Scout Ship. This includes two new units this year (Pack 103 - Meadowlark Apts and Crew 173 - Belzer Amateur Radio Crew). Again, this year, 100% of our Cub Scout Packs attended Cub Scout Day camp or Webelos Adventure camp; 100% of our Boy Scout Troops attended long-term summer camp, high adventure treks, or attended the National Jamboree. You helped Scouts achieve 708 rank advancements, with 41 district youth earning the rank of Eagle Scout. The district also logged 5,171 community service hours, and thanks to your generosity, the Northeast District's Friends of Scouting campaign brought in nearly \$62,500 to support Scouting activities throughout the Crossroads of America Council. Last, but not least, with your help, the Northeast District once again achieved Gold Level in our Journey to Excellence this year!

As we enter 2018, the Northeast District will once again be led by an outstanding group of volunteers. Your Northeast District Key Three for 2018 will be Jon Guimont (District Chairman - succeeding Steve Creason), Kim Wiggins (District Commissioner) and Laura Clay (District Executive). A New Year's Resolution for Scouts and Scouters Alike!

OK, it's 2018 already. It's not too late to make a New Year's resolution, or add a high value one that is aligned to one of the Northeast District's Top Five Initiatives for 2018. How about tanking your **SCOUT TRAINING** to the next level...this applies to you or to a Scout in Troop, Crew, Ship or Team!



SCOUT TRAINING OPTION

If you have a SCOUT in a Troop, Crew, Ship or Team that is at least 13 years of age and a First-Class Scout or higher (before the respective course starts), how about encouraging them to take their Scout leadership skills to the next level by successfully completing National Youth Leader Training (NYLT) during 2018. Regardless of whether they currently hold a significant Scout leadership position in a unit, or they just aspire to hold such a position in the future, they should complete this offering.

NYLT is an action-packed program designed to provide BSA youth members with leadership skills and experience that, if applied back in the participant's home unit, will improve the home unit's performance. During 2018, there are three courses being offered:

- A Spring Course offered over two week-ends (APRIL 6-8 and APRIL 27-29, 2018)
- A <u>Summer Course</u> offered over a single week (JUNE 17-23, 2018)
- A <u>Fall Course</u> offered over two week-ends (SEPT 28-30 and OCT 12-14, 2018)

The cost for NYLT is \$325 per participant. A deposit of \$25 per participant is required to hold a slot; if all fees are paid in full 30-days prior to the course, then an early-bird fee of only \$215 per participant will be required! SCOUTER TRAINING OPTIONS

If you are a SCOUTER in a Pack, Troop, Crew, Ship or Team serving in a direct Scout-contact leader (e.g., Den Leader, Assistant Pack Master, Pack Master, Assistant Scout Master or Scout Master) and have not yet completed your required position-specific training, you should commit to completing this training early in 2018! So, what are the required position-specific training sessions and how do I complete these required course(s)? Check out the details on the Northeast District Training website.

So, you've already completed your required position-specific training. That's GREAT, but there is still a resolution option for you. How about completing Wood Badge this year! Wood Badge is the top adult leadership course offering offered by the Crossroads of America Council. There will be three opportunities this year:

- A <u>Spring Course</u> offered over two week-ends (APRIL 12-14 and MAY 10-12, 2018)
- A <u>Summer Course</u> offered over two week-ends (JUNE 10-16, 2018) Guest instructors will participate in this one-week leadership experience including Chief Scout Executive Michael Surbaugh, Past National President Wayne Perry, CEO of the Summit Bechtel Reserve Jack Furst and other National Board Members, BSA Executives, Donors and Philanthropists.
- A Fall Course offered over two week-ends (SEPT 8-10 and SEPT 29-OCT 1, 2018)

OK...as a SCOUTER you've already completed both of the above resolution options... **CONGRATULATIONS!** However, you are not off the hook when it comes to a New Year's Scout Training Resolution. There are other national BSA training options available to you if you truly want to take your training to the zenith.

How about attending an adult training conference at the Philmont Training Center? There are over 70 different weeklong learning sessions offered in New Mexico during 2018. You say that you can't make it to New Mexico because you can't leave your family for a week...no problem...Philmont offers programs for your family while you attend your conference!

If you are looking for somewhere closer to Indianapolis, there are also BSA training offerings available at <u>John D Tickle National Training and Leadership Center</u> at The Summit Bechtel Reserve...a short ~7-hour drive from Indianapolis. The Summit offers 8 different weeklong learning conferences.

Or if you are looking for Scout training in a more exotic location, the Boy Scouts of America has this covered as well with training conferences offered at both <u>Florida Sea Base</u> <u>Conference Center</u> (8 course offerings) and at <u>Northern Tier High Adventure Base</u> (4 course offerings — including "brrr"...Cold Weather Leader Training).

We certainly hope that you will accept our challenge to take your training to the next level. As they say, every Scout deserves a trained leader!

Summer Camp Deadlines - What, Where and When?

Yes, I know that it's only January, but now is the time to begin thinking warmer thoughts. Can you say Summer Camp? There are multiple upcoming deadlines related to Summer Camp attendance and they vary depending on whether you are talking about Cub Scout Day Camp, Webelos Adventure Camp, or Boy Scout Summer Camp. Hopefully, this article will help to clarify these multitude of upcoming deadlines.

Cub Scout Day Camp

The cost for a Cub Scout to attend a weeklong Day Camp Session at Camp Belzer this year is \$150 per Scout (if paid on or before MAY 1, 2018), \$175 if paid in full between MAY 2 and JUNE 1, 2018, or \$190 if paid after JUNE 2, 2018. In order for a unit to attend any of Camp Belzer's Cub Scout Day Camps, a \$50 non-refundable deposit per Scout is due by MARCH 1, 2018. This deposit will be applied towards the final fees due. When the deposit is submitted, the unit must provide a Scout's name and rank for each spot, but this can be used for another Scout from your Pack if the original Scout cannot attend. To register online, please visit the council's website.

Webelos Adventure Camp

The total cost for a Webelo Scout to attend the three-day Adventure Camp Session at Camp Kikthawenund is \$185 in council (\$210 out of council) if paid on or before MAY 1, 2018, or \$210 in council (\$235 out of council) if paid between MAY 2 and JUNE 1, 2018, or \$225 in council (\$250 out of council) if paid in full after JUNE 1, 2018. In order for a unit to attend any of Camp Kikthawenund's Webelo Adventure Camp Sessions, a \$50 non-refundable deposit per Scout is due by MARCH 1, 2018. This deposit will be applied towards the final fees due. When the deposit is submitted, the unit must provide a Scout's name and rank

for each spot, but this can be used for another Scout from your Pack if the original Scout cannot attend. To register online please visit the council's <u>website</u>.

Boy Scout Summer Camp

IMPORTANT...THIS WRITE-UP CONTAINS NEW DEADLINES FOR TROOP PAYMENTS!

In order for a Troop to attend Summer Camp at either Ransburg Scout Reservation or Camp Krietenstein, a \$150 non-refundable deposit is due when the camp site reservation is submitted. Additionally, a \$50 non-refundable deposit per scout is due by FEBRUARY 15, 2018. The total cost for a Boy Scout to attend a weeklong session at either Ransburg Scout Reservation or Camp Kreitenstein is \$290 in council (\$315 out of council) if paid on or before APRIL 15, 2018, or \$310 in council (\$335 out of council) if paid between APRIL 16 and MAY 15, 2018, or \$330 in council (\$355 out of council) if paid in full after MAY 16, 2018. To register for summer camp at Ransburg Scout Reservation, visit the council's website; to register for summer camp at Camp Krietenstein visit the council's website.

The NED Recipe Exchange – Hearty SPAM® Breakfast Skillet

This month we have selected a recipe that reminded the author of a past Northeast District Camporee, more appropriately called a SPAM® oree (every event had something to do with SPAM®). So here goes...a recipe that uses that "All-American" canned meat...



Prep Time: 30 minutes. Serves 6

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 12-ounce can of SPAM® Classic julienned
- 1/2 cup chopped bell pepper
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 teaspoon dried basil leaves
- 2 cups frozen diced or shredded potatoes
- 8 eggs
- 6 drops hot pepper sauce
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- 2 teaspoons vegetable oil

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In large nonstick skillet, cook potatoes, onion and bell pepper in oil over mediumhigh heat, stirring constantly, 5 minutes. Add SPAM® Classic; cook and stir 5 minutes longer
- 2. In small bowl, combine eggs, basil, salt, black pepper and hot sauce; blend well. Pour over mixture in skillet; cover.
