



## 2021 Crossroads of America Council Promise to Parents Cub Scouts

Objective: Parents will say Scouting in the Crossroads of America Council (CAC) offers their family fun and adventurous activities. This fun and adventure will help their son or daughter develop leadership skills and values important to strong citizenship and service to others.

### Unit Expectations for Packs

- Recruit new youth into the pack to grow the size and strength of the program (Girls should represent at least 25% of the total membership)
- Use the Ideal Year of Scouting (IYOS) program plan and submit Pack calendar to respective district by June 30
- Lion & Tiger dens will follow CAC Program Delivery Method (tools supplied through the council)
- 75% of Cub Scouts will advance one rank during the Scouting year
- Participate in Day Camp and/or Cub Scout overnight camp with a goal of 60% of your Scouts attending
- Participate in Scouting for Food and Adopt-a-School community service projects
- Recharter by December 1 with at least 75% of your Scouts retained
- Commit to sell popcorn with a goal of 50% of your Scouts selling
- Participate in the Friends of Scouting campaign through the Governor's Luncheon for Scouting or a family presentation

### Timeline

- February/April 2021:

Packs are informed about the Promise to Parents and the new evaluation process

- November/December 2021:

Units receive evaluation through their district and are informed of areas that need improvement; Support will be given to units through commissioner corps and district committee

- November/December 2022:

If improvement is not made, the commissioner team, in partnership with their District Executive, will work with the chartering organization to identify the barriers to success, which may include the selection of new unit Key 3 leadership that are committed to addressing the metrics to ensure the Promise to Parents is delivered to families
